WAYNESBORO TOWN HALL MEETING REGARDING OVERDOSE AND ITS IMPACT ON THE WAYNESBORO COMMUNITY

Due to the increased fatal drug overdoses throughout the County, the Franklin County District Attorney's Office has partnered with the Waynesboro Police Department, the Franklin County Coroner's Office and the Franklin/Fulton Drug and Alcohol Office to host the third Franklin County Town Hall Meeting to educate area residents, parents and students about drug use in their specific area.

The meeting will take place on Wednesday, September 28, 2016. It will be located at the Otterbein Church Recreation Center, at 912 South Potomac Street, Waynesboro.

Doors will open at 6:00 and the meeting will begin at 6:30.

By organizing subject matter experts to address the current issues that the Waynesboro community is having, we can better reach our target audience with a focused approach, and help remove stigma that prevents people from seeking help. Local experts such as Franklin County District Attorney Matt Fogal, Waynesboro Chief of Police James Sourbier, Paramedic Jordan Conner, and Ken Dickinson (treatment/rehabilitation expert from Gaudenzia), will present information related to the local area and will be available for questions. The meeting will also feature substance abusers in recovery and families of substance abusers, and all will speak about their personal challenges and provide attendees with a first-hand account of what each side of the issue experiences.
