Purpose of the Guide

This resource guide was produced by the Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition (SCRC). The SCRC was developed from a group of community stakeholders who explored the need for a homeless shelter in 2009. This original committee has grown to a group of over 75 people who are interested in establishing the SCRC. The purpose of the SCRC is to provide a central location for access to social services and youth programming. This guide was created and developed to make it easier to identify social services that are available in Shippensburg.

The Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition was developed in part because the town of Shippensburg is located in both Cumberland County and Franklin County which can lead to confusion about how and where to access social services. Currently there are no homeless or domestic violence shelters currently in Shippensburg. These services and many others are available in the neighboring towns of Carlisle and Chambersburg. Both counties have their own guides to social services so this guide focuses on the services that are available in the town of Shippensburg.
