- I. Welcome and Introductions – Judge Van Horn called the meeting to order at 12:05PM and welcomed the group. Casey Bogner was introduced as the new Chief Public Defender. Judge Van Horn introduced the guest speakers, Lindsay Walls from GRASP and Todd Sackett from JNET.
- II. Approval of June Minutes – The minutes were approved by consensus.
- III. Presentation: Grief Recovery After Substance Passing (GRASP) – Lindsay Walls – see attached handout. A candlelight vigil will be held on 8/31 at 8PM in Waynesboro. The Mercersburg Lions Club is also hosting an event on 8/31 from 6-8:30PM. Noah’s House will be hosting “Breaking the Chains of Addiction”, with guest speaker Tim Ryan, on September 22nd from 3-9PM.
- IV. Presentation: Todd Sackett, Business Analyst, PA JNET – JNET Activities and Projects – see attached handout.
- V. New Business – None.
- VI. CJAB Office Reports
 - A. CJAB Office Report
 1. IP – 2018-2020 funding was awarded on 8/10. The team is meeting to discuss a PMR to move funding to cover the cost of cell phone service and to request additional funding for an officer and D&A case manager.
 2. MH Co-responder – Application is still open and under review, if awarded, the grant will start on 10/1. The Co-responder program presented at the August 1st PCCD MH and Justice Advisory Committee.
 3. CAC – 2018 NCA members’ application was submitted to PCCD. Working on PMRs to include program income and expenditures as part of the total budget.
 4. D&A Pretrial (Get Back Up) – Working on a PMR to request a 12 month extension. Fiscal is reviewing the wages and benefit costs.

5. Drug Court/BJA – Still unable to drawdown funds. Fiscal is contacting our program manager’s supervisor in an effort to resolve.
 6. Jail to Community Treatment (Vivitrol Program) – DOC is offering 4.5 million dollars, it is being implied these will be non-competitive funds. The RFP is with the DOC Solicitor. Grants and program staff are meeting to work on components of the application.
 7. Reentry Coalition – Working with the community to provide Reentry Simulations. A narrative has been developed for simulation hosts to utilize when requesting grant funds to cover the cost of the simulation. A new landlord/housing resource guide is being developed.
- B. PCCD Liaison Report – There are two Endowment Act grants open, applications are due by 9/28, Glenda is working with Dianne Kelso. Glenda will be sending out information for 2019-2020 VOJO funds, applications are due by 9/28. PCCD and CCAP are offering mini grants, in the amount of \$1,500, for technical assistance and training. The mini grants are on a rolling calendar timeline.
 - C. Public Safety Report – No report.

VII. Committee Reports

- A. Executive Committee – No updates other than the provided minutes.
- B. Criminal Case Flow Management – The July 9th meeting was cancelled. The next meeting is scheduled for September 20th; please provide agenda items to Mark Singer.
- C. Behavioral Health – SIM update has been finalized, determining how it will be distributed. Top priorities have been established: Crisis Entry (Urgent Care Triage Model), Outcomes (DL20 tool), Housing and Complex Cases. State funds have been approved for Mental Health to expand community residential treatment housing by eight beds and to continue the Co-responder Program. Commissioner Thomas noted there is a statewide best practices meeting in December.
- D. First Contact – Met on 7/20, discussed the sustainability of the Co-responder program. Hoping to have CIT training in the fall. Criminal complaint forms have changed, the jail is receiving old and new forms, some police departments do not have the new version of CNET. Fingerprint compliance remains at 91%, prints being missing are those whose charges have been dropped.
- E. Technology – Have not met since July. The Sheriff’s Office is moving forward with Teleosoft, which will streamline the warrant, PFA and real estate processes.
- F. Victims Impact – No report.
- G. Juvenile Justice – Meeting frequently to work on the stakeholder training presentation. Meeting Monday to review the PowerPoint. Met with the Waynesboro School Board regarding Youth Court. The board will vote on 8/28 determining if youth court will be a club or after school program, hoping after this year that it will be part of the 9th or 10th grade curriculum. Kristin Hamilton and Kim Eaton will speak at the October Youth Court Conference.
- H. Forensic Initiatives – Please refer to the minutes provided in the agenda packet.

What is GRASP?

GRASP is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization with over 100 chapters in the U.S. and Canada and is run completely by volunteers. It was started by a family who lost their child to overdose and wanted to provide support for others where there previously was none.

It is widely believed that the grief of losing someone to overdose/substance abuse is unique and that no one understands this unique grief like someone else who has experienced it. Thus began a free peer led support group for any community member who has experienced this type of loss.

Why do I do GRASP?

I lost my little brother Marc, April 22, 2017 to a fentanyl laced heroin overdose. I quickly realized that advocacy work helped me deal with my grief. Because our county was lacking in resources for the grief community, I decided to establish my own chapter of GRASP in Waynesboro. I wanted to keep my brother alive by helping others walking the same journey and be there for the families that are yet to come.

GRASP Goals:

1. Provide a safe, confidential environment for expressing ones feelings
2. Judgement and stigma free
3. Provide support information

My Goals:

1. Validation of member's feelings
2. Connect people in the grief community
3. Provide a voice for the grief community
