Purpose of the Guide

This resource guide was produced by the Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition (SCRC). The SCRC was developed from a group of community stakeholders who explored the need for a homeless shelter and other social services and youth programs in 2009. The Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition is a collaborative effort to provide quality social services and youth programs that are accessible and safe and that recognize the dignity and worth of each person. Our goal is to help community members reach their full potential. This guide was created and developed to make it easier to identify social services that are available in Shippensburg.

The Shippensburg Community Resource Coalition was developed in part because the town of Shippensburg is located in both Cumberland County and Franklin County which can lead to confusion about how and where to access social services. Currently there are no homeless or domestic violence shelters in Shippensburg. These services and many others are available in the neighboring towns of Carlisle and Chambersburg. Both counties have their own guides to social services so this guide focuses on the services that are available within the Shippensburg Area School District boundaries. The Supported Employment program is a mobile, county Mental Health-funded service that assists individuals who live in Cumberland and Perry County with mental health diagnoses to find, obtain, and keep competitive employment. It differs from other vocational services for those with disabilities in that it *does not* require extensive evaluations for work readiness, provide on-site job coaching, or placement. Employment Specialists assists individuals in obtaining community jobs anyone can apply for that pay at least minimum wage, including both part and full time positions. Typically, support is provided outside of the work place and for as long as the individual requests assistance.
