Franklin County, PA is home to over 13,500 veterans, many of whom are rated with some level of disability by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). This number do not include the thousands of current military personnel who call Franklin County home. Nor does it include the veterans not on file with the VA. At the Franklin County Veterans Affairs Office, we are doing more for our area veterans by expanding our outreach services.

Save-A-Vet Save-A-Pet

This program is dedicated to helping Franklin County Veterans with service connected disabilities lead happier, healthier, more productive lives by pairing them with a service dog. Service dogs have proven to be highly valuable in assisting veterans with disabilities including, but not limited to, diabetes, seizure disorders, post traumatic stress, psychiatric disorders, and traumatic brain injury. Out dogs come from local rescues, shelters, and a few select breeding lines.









The dogs spend a year in highly specialized training and are then capable of serving veterans with a number of physical and psychological needs. While the dog is in training, the veteran will not be responsible for training costs, initial veterinary care or other incidental expenses. After the dog has completed the rigorous year long three phase training (with the dog and the veteran training together for the last phase)

Who Qualifies for a dog?

If you are a Franklin County
Veteran who is need and
interested in applying for a service
dog, please read the following
information carefully to determine
if you meet our eligibility
requirements.

- Active duty service in any branch of the U.S. Armed Forces during and era; and
- Received and honorable or general (under honorable conditions) discharge; and
- Have a service-connected disability; and
- Released from all active service and reserve obligations; and
- Meets all Franklin County
 Veterans Affairs requirements for application into the program, applied, and have been accepted into the program
